What is Hadracha Bet:

Hadracha Bet is the **second year** of our flagship leadership programme, designed to guide participants on their journey from chanichim (participants) to madrichim (leaders).

In the same format as Hadracha Aleph, once enrolled participants will come to **fortnightly sessions** that explore a range of themes centred on leadership and FZY. The course also includes a **Shabbaton** weekend called 'Hadsem,' where participants from both the Aleph (Year 12) and Bet (Year 13) come together for a special FZY shabbat cantered on the theme of leadership.

This year part of the course will include completing a **Level 2 CPD-recognised safeguarding course**, further enhancing our participants skills and qualifications.

The sessions included are a chance to build on the foundations from year 1. Some of these sessions include, 'How to Discipline', 'how to effectively work with your fellow madrichim', 'how to run and write a session' and many, many more fun and exciting programming. The cohort will also have the opportunity to write and lead their own sessions for their fellow participants, giving them the opportunity to practically apply the skills they have learnt.

Participants not only receive leadership training but also are given the space to explore their relationship and connection with Israel, Judaism, and social action. We believe this holistic approach equips them to become the next generation of FZY Madrichim (leaders). Many of our top leaders have risen through the ranks after graduating from our Hadracha course, demonstrating our proven ability to train and inspire future leaders.

The skills gained from this course are ideal for highlighting in job and university applications, and the opportunities provided to participants will significantly boost their career prospects as well.

Here are some more details about some of the opportunities offered as part of the course:

HadSem (Hadracha Seminar)— HadSem is a weekend seminar designed for participants of the Hadracha Course, including both Aleph and Bet levels. Taking place over Shabbat, this residential experience offers a blend of learning, skill-building, and leadership development in a fun and engaging setting. Throughout the weekend, participants will engage in a series of interactive workshops, collaborative activities, and discussions focused on enhancing their leadership abilities and honing essential skills. Hadsem is included in the price of the Hadracha course.

Here are some more details about some of the FZY opportunities that Hadracha Aleph opens the door to:

<u>Veida (20th-23rd February) -</u> Veida is a legendary Shabbaton weekend in FZY, as it is for all ages who are members of the movement. The members come together to decide new motions, rules and policies for the movement while electing new positions within the movement. All of this is done over a classic FZY shabbat full of shabbatmosphere, Veida is one not to miss! <u>This Shabbaton is separate to the price of the Hadracha course</u>.

Kedma Campaign (DATE TBC)- The Kedma campaign is an opportunity for the participants to build and manage an activist campaign in Europe for a Jewish related cause, an opportunity exclusively offered to the Hadracha Bet cohort. Specifics and logistics of this campaign will be determined and decided during the course with the participants contribution. Previous examples of the Kedma campaign were volunteering in Israel after the 7/10 attacks, initiatives to rebuild a synagogue in Ukraine and repairing a Berlin memorial that had been vandalised in an anti-Semitic attack. *The price of Kedma is separate to the Hadracha course*.

<u>Summer Camp 2025 – Once</u> the participants have graduated from the Hadracha course, they are qualified to become madrichim on our summer camp. This past summer we ran a highly successful summer camp which was the first leading experience for many of our madrichim, graduating directly from the Hadracha Bet cohort of 2023-24. You could be next! <u>Madrichim do not have to pay to lead summer camp.</u>



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
